Ontario	https://511on.ca/list/seasonalloads	The current RLP restrictions/exemptions under Section 122 of the Highway Traffic Act (https://www.ontario.ca/laws/statute/90h08#BK216) can be summarized as follows: • Limits operation of commercial motor vehicles or trailers to operate at weights up to 5,000 kg. • Exempts two-axle trucks carrying heating fuel, livestock feed, and any vehicles transporting live poultry to have up to 7,500 kg per axle as part of intermediate weight standard. • Exempts some vehicles from regulations such as vehicles engaged in highway maintenance, public utility emergency vehicles, waste disposal and vehicles that transport milk.
